One night the girl disappeared and they found that a boy from another band had stolen her. He took her to his own people, and on the way set a fire which burned the grass. The burnt grass blackened the girl's feet. They called her Black-footed Girl and came to call her band the Black-feet. He set the fire so as to burn up their trail.
