Head Farmer and Cheif of Indian Police of the Standing Rock Agency, D.T.

Sir:

Buffalo munt on the Sioux Indian Reservation. You will remove all trespassers found hunting or trapping on the reservation and prevent the Indians from interferring with any person off the reservation, also prevent them molestong any person found on the reservation as that will be attended to by the Indian Police and yourself. The time allowed is forty days from the 14th inst. and you will see that the Indians are all back at this Agency on or before the 23rd of October, and if any parties wish to leave for home at any time before the main perty you will see that they are permitted, by the Indian Soldiers, to do so. You will use your best judgement that in all matters and questions that may arise and if necessary communicate with me by courrier.

N. B. You will not interfere with the Indians as to their rules of hunting but you must see that no disorderly sot is committed, and fou will use the police force in the enforcement of order. Running Antelope is appointed Indian leader of the hunt and he will aid you in all matters of
