Captain E. G. Fechet, 8th Cavalry,

ill proceed with Troops"F" and "G" 8th Cavalry, the Hotchkiss gun nd one Gatling gun to the crossing of Oak Creek by the Sitting ull road for the purpose of preventing the escape or rescue of itting Bull should the Indian Police succeed in arresting him.

The command will move out at 12:00 o'clock midnight, in light arching order, and will be supplied with 50 rounds of carbine and 12 rounds of revolver ammunition per man, 4000 rounds of mmunition for fatling gun, one days cooked rations and one days orage.

After receiving the prisoner, <u>Captain Fechet</u> will return with is command to this post reporting to the <u>Commanding Officer</u> on rrival.

If on arrival at Oak Creek, Captain Fefchet learns that the olice are fighting or need assistance, he will push on and if ecessary follow Sitting Bull as long as possible with his suplies, keeping the Post Commander informed by courier of his ovements.

The march will be so regulated as to reach Cak Creek by 6.30 clock, a. h., tomorrow the 15th instant.

Should arrest be made every precaution will be taken to prevent scape or rescue.

Two Indian scouts will accompany the command.

Assistant Surgeon A. R. Chapin, Medical Department, will report to Captain Fechet for duty with the expedition.

First Lieutenant S. L. H. Slocum. 8th Cavalry, with Troop "F" will also report to Captain Fechet for orders.

Second Lieutenant E. C. Brooks, 8th Cavalry will also report
