to identify the warrior society with the men he met. Possibly some other early explorers made some record.

My adoptive fathers, White Bull and One Bull, had hair shirts, but I know little about how they came in possession of them. They were not, however, handed down but made to fit the men themselves and decorated to illustrate events in their own lives.

I shall be very happy to have a colored slide of your hair shirt. Weygold always insisted that the hair on these shirts was that of female relatives of the owner and not from enemy scalps.
