I enclose you a copy (with map) of my little Monograph on Crooks Brief Campaign of Men 1-26 1876 and am comparing what I have compiled from various sources with Chapter XVIII of Warpath.

I'm wondering why the Indians called Crook "Nine Stars"? Have never heard of it before.

I'm not found any evidence that Reynolds regarded Grant as "untrustworthy".

If you read Reynolds Sketch in Cullum and especially note in the recently published "History of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Cav" Reynolds full page portrait you will come pretty nearly finding out why he "bungled". As I size it up, he was a very "weak sister". The cold night march of Men 16-17; the difficulty in getting down from the high ground to the level where the village lay; Moore's failure to carry out his instructions (which Reynolds should have corrected then & there) were too much for him. He was not equal to the job!
