izations comprised within the community, or to a propor-1 tionate share thereof, except as such succession may be 2 3 limited by the charter, subject to existing provisions of 4 law with respect to the maintenance of suits against the United States, and subject further to such provision for $\mathbf{5}$ 6 the apportionment of such assets among nonmembers of the community having vested rights therein, as may be 7 8 prescribed by the charter.

9 SEC. 5. When any Indian community shall have been 10 chartered, it shall be the duty of the Commissioner of Indian 11 Affairs to cause regular reports concerning their respective 12 functions to be made to the constituted authorities of the 13 community, to advise and consult with such authorities on 14 problems of local administration and Federal policy, and to allow such authorities free access to the records and 15 16 files of the local agency.

Any Indian community shall have the power to com-17 pel the transfer from the community of any persons em-18 ployed in the administration of Indian affairs within the 19 20 territorial limits of the community other than persons ap-21 pointed by the community: Provided, however, That the $\mathbf{22}$ Commissioner of Indian Affairs may prescribe such condi-23 tions for the exercise of this power as will assure to employ-24 ees of the Indian Service a reasonable security of tenure, an opportunity to demonstrate their capacities over a stated 25
