

1 opened, to sale, settlement, entry, or other form of disposal
2 by Presidential proclamation, or under any of the public
3 land laws of the United States. Any land so withdrawn
4 shall have the status of tribal or community lands of the
5 tribe, reservation, or community within whose territorial
6 limits they are located: *Provided, however,* That valid rights
7 or claims of any persons to any lands so withdrawn existing
8 on the date of the withdrawal shall not be affected by
9 this Act.

10 The Secretary of the Interior shall determine what
11 lands, lying outside of areas classified for consolidation under
12 Indian ownership pursuant to section 6 of this title, are
13 not needed by the Indians, and such lands shall be reopened
14 to sale, settlement, entry, or other lawful form of disposal
15 in accordance with existing law.

16 SEC. 4. The existing periods of trust placed upon
17 Indian allotments and unallotted tribal lands and any restric-
18 tion of alienation thereof, are hereby extended and con-
19 tinued until otherwise directed by Congress. The authority
20 of the Secretary of the Interior to issue to Indians patents
21 in fee or certificates of competency or otherwise to remove
22 the restrictions on lands allotted to individual Indians under
23 any law or treaty is hereby revoked.

24 No lands or other capital assets owned by an Indian
25 community, or any interest therein, shall be voluntarily or
