Old Relics. There are practically none of these things among our Indians now, as nearly everything of value in this line was bought up years ago. Once in a while some old woman will bring in a damaged article and ask fancy prices for it, but the chances are, it has no value whatever.

As a rule, we have some squaw buckskin dresses on hand at all times, and generally one or more of the girl's suits, but we usually have to special out men's garments, such as leggins and shirts.
