

Latitude 37° 48' 15'' - Longitude 99° 56'

A United States fort situated on the north bank of the Arkansas River on the Santa Fe trail about 9 miles east of old Fort Atkinson, in Ford County, now town of that name.

Post established September 9, 1865.

Reservation declared June 22, 1868. Area of reservation as declared 43,461 acres - reduced by act approved December 15, 1880, about 28,000 acres, leaving about 14,661 acres.

Reservation turned over to the Secretary of the Interior in 1885.

Relinquished ~~June~~ Jan. 12, 1885, under authority of Act of July 5, 1884.
