

## Record for the Month of September, 1868.

for Indian trails, On the 26<sup>th</sup>, Cassin is reported that he came from  
#Hays, across trail over 25 Indians, one of them cursed him in English.  
29<sup>th</sup> Lieut Hale 3<sup>rd</sup> Inf. Co arrived to join 4<sup>th</sup> expedition, Capt Byrne  
10<sup>th</sup> Cav' also arrived to take command of 10<sup>th</sup>, Major Kild having  
gone on leave. Major Page left with escort with forage for command.  
On 29<sup>th</sup> Lieut Wallace returned from south of the river  
had seen no Indians - Buffalo were plenty. Reported for duty  
again at Post.

Genl Kelly confined to his room by an accident - Hedges sta-  
tioned at Post. 1<sup>st</sup> expedition organized - Proposed to  
make a depot of supplies 100 miles south on Beaver Creek.

The changes on matters bearing upon the Post  
proper have been slight during the month.

The Hospital has been increased by a rough frame  
building capable of holding 12 beds and a tent  
board consisting of three tents continuous and  
one tent disconnected - This increase was rendered  
necessary by the influx of patients from the different  
Commands concentrating at the Post.

On the 8<sup>th</sup> a. a. Surg. A. S. Fitch, U. S. a reported  
for duty by order of General Phinney.

On 16<sup>th</sup> Special Requisition was made for supplies - (O & L - B)

Issues were made to different Med. Officers.

Balance due Hospital Fund Sept 31<sup>st</sup> \$31.21

There has been \$101, 00 expended for the benefit of  
the sick.

One man died during month - Corp John Marks "F"  
Co 3<sup>rd</sup> Inf. of ac. Dysentery - received from General  
Fuley's command.
