Dear Mr. Campbell:

In your letter of February 12, 1957, you request information relating to some sixteen Army Posts, located in several western States.

Enclosed are duplicate copies of our registration statements with respect to the following fifteen Posts: Fort Brady, Mich., Fort Clark, Tex., Fort Dodge, Kan., Fort Duncan, Tex., Fort Garland, Colo., Fort Gibson, Ind. Terr., Post of Lauderdale, Miss., Fort Leavenworth, Kan., Fort Lyon, Colo., Mount Vernon Barracks, Ala., Fort Kinggold, Tex., Fort Slocum (David's Island), N. Y., Fort Supply, Okla., Fort Wallace, Kan., and Fort Wayne, Mich.

For each of the foregoing posts these sheets give a brief history and indicate the records in custody of the National Archives.

Our search did not disclose any separate series of records for Fort Smith, Arkansas. However, in a large folio volume entitled, "Outline Index, Military Posts and Stations," there are four manuscript pages devoted to a description of Fort Smith, its establishment in 1817, its abandonment in 1871, and to citations of various publications that refer to the Post. Photostatic copies of these four pages could be made for forty cents each or a total of \$1.60. Remittance should be sent by check or money order payable to the General Services Administration and mailed to the National Archives and Records Service.
