**Chippewa of Lake Nipigon.** A Chippewa band officially known by this name residing in the vicinity of L. Nipigon, n. of L. Superior, in Ontario. The "Christians," composing nearly one-half the entire band, occupy a village at the head of the lake near the Hudson Bay Company's post; the remainder live about 100 m.
