from Indian Rifle Posts. The scalp of Samuel Leforce was found in an abandoned Indian Camp. Two horses, saddles and bridles belonging to Mr. Quinlan were taken from Murray and Leforce. On the 24th of Sept. 1878 at Mead City, Washington O'Connor, mail carrier was killed, two (2) horses and 1 sett harness taken.

I was unable to find out what was taken from the two houses in Mead City as the place was abandoned. One horse, belonging to a cattle herder, name unknown, was taken near Bluff Creek Rancho on the 17th of Sept. The foregoing are all the persons killed or injured, and property taken or destroyed at or near the route of the Indian trail South of the Arkansas river, except at Anthony and Street's Camp on Sand Creek where Mr. Street lost on the 19th of Sept, one (1) sett (2 horse), harness, one (1) Buffalo robe, one (1) pr California Blankets, two (2) coats, one (1) pr Boots new, one suit of under clothing, one (1) gun Cal. 45. There were no cattle or people between Sand Creek and the Arkansas River, along the Indian trail, when I passed over it. Accompanying this report is a map of the Country with my trail marked in red ink.
