P to the requirement of Pan 1461 Goss Key. I have the honor to request that I have been arrested by the civil authorities charged with selling liquor to Indians.

These proceedings are instituted by the false swearing of a man by the name of Wheeler and another named William Seaman ("aMas Apache Bill") and were caused by my official action in their cases for introducing liquor into the Indian country and of which they have been found guilty the measures are quickly retaliatory and are conducted mainly by Chaplain H. G. White N. S. A. against whom I have preferred charges and S. A. Wheeler whom I prosecuted.

I respectfully request that I be authorized to employ counsel-- also that Bob Maior I Paye 3rd Infantry and 2nd Lieut F. G. Wallace 3rd Infantry be allowed the same indulgence they being also arrested and the proceedings against them going in retaliation for their official act.
