Yellow Bear's Band of Arrapahoes numbering ten men and one woman, and Little Rocks' band of Cheyennes numbering three men - passed through this Post, in route for their Camp on the Middle Fork of Pawnee - on the 21st Mst.

Yellow Bear report that he is going Northward and then Southwest to Crooked Creek- Little Rock says the same.
