I have the honor to report the following relative to the movement of Indians since last Report.

On the 19th inst. 10 men and one woman of Arrapahoe tribe of Indians (name of band unknown) came into this Post from Crooked Creek, and returned in same direction.

On same day, R. M. Wright, Lime Contractor for this Post reported that 3 Revolvers, 2 Horses and other small property, were taken from his Camp on the Middle branch of the Pawnee, about 25 miles from thes Post, by a party of Cheyenne Indians.

On the 20th instant, "One Bear's" band of "Kiowas" numbering twenty(20) men and one (1) woman, coming from the Ute Country passed through this Post, en route to Fort Zarad Kas.

On the same day, the Wagon Master of Desmarais and Bernard's train reported the running off of his Stock, ($1 \le 9$ mules and 3 Horses) by "Cheyenne" Indians at Pawnee Fort above Cimmarron.

On the 21st instant, the Arrapahoes numbering one hundred (100) Lodged, under "Yellow Bear" and "Say Down Man" arrived at this Post, from Walnut Creek, and are still emnamped close to the Post.

A large body of "Cheyennes" are reported as having been making preparations, evidently with the intention of attacking this Post, but as yet have made no hostile demonstrations further than attacking any small parties, they may come across, at a distance from the Post.
