The attention of the Officers and soldiers of this Department is called

to the engagement with hostile Indians on Beaver Creek, Kansas, October 18, 1868, in which a detachment of Cavalry (escorting Brevet Major General E. A. Carr, Major 5th Cavalry, to his Regiment), under the command of Brevet Lieut. Colonel Louis H. Carpenter, Captain 10th Cavalry, consisting of Companies I, 10th Cavalry, under Captain George W. Graham and 1st Lieut. Myron J. Amick, and H, 10th Cavalry, under 1st Lieut. Charles Banzhaf and 2d Lt. Louis H. Orleman, engaged about five hundred

(500) Indians for several hours, inflicting a loss on the savages of ten (10)

killed and many wounded, losing three (3) enlisted men wounded.

The Major General Commanding desires to tender his thanks for the gallantry and bravery displayed by this small command against so large a body of Indians.
