A NAPOLEON ORDER
 LENINGRAD, Russia, Aug 6 (A.
 P.)--An army order issued by Na-
 poleon during the French occupa-
 tion of Moscow in 1812 has been
 acquired by the Museum of Havo-
 nion from a private book dealer.
 The order, written on a large sheet
 of parchment, commands the
 French military authorities in Mos-
 cow to shoot down on the spot all
 persons found setting fire to the
 city.

'Spirit of Lincoln
 Hovers Over Nation'
 WASHINGTON, Feb. 12 (C. N.
 S.)--The spirit of Abraham
 Lincoln still hovers over the cap-
 ital and the republic for which
 he gave his last full measure of
 devotion."
 This message was the burden
 of the eulogy read to the Senate
 this afternoon by Senator Reed
 Smoot, Republican, of Utah, in
 commemoration of the 118th
 birthday anniversary of the
 "martyred rail-splitter pres-
 ident."
 Tracing Lincoln's political
 career, Smoot declared that he
 was "national minded, from the
 very beginning," and that his
 political philosophes have been
 followed since the day he en-
 tered congress, 80 years ago next
 December.
