Know ye, That George Silk a  
Private of Captain Smith of Company (A), 3<sup>rd</sup> Regiment of Indian Infantry Home Guard  
VOLUNTEERS who was enrolled on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of June  
one thousand eight hundred and sixty four to serve three years or  
during the war, is hereby **Discharged** from the service of the United States,  
this first day of May, 1865, at Fort Gibson  
Cherokee Nation by reason of Wanted out per A. O. 1115.  
(No objection to his being re-enlisted is known to exist.)\*

Said George Silk was born in  
in the State of Cherokee Nation, is 16 years of age,  
five feet eight inches high, Dark complexion, Black eyes,  
Black hair, and by occupation, when enrolled, a Farmer
