VOLUNTEERS who was enrolled on the *thirtieth* day of *July*

one thousand eight hundred and *thirty* to serve *three* years or
during the war, is hereby **Discharged** from the service of the United States,

this *thirty first* (31st) day of *May*, 1865, at Fort Gibson,
Cherokee Nation by reason of Muster-out, per S. O. No 119, Dept of Arkansas of 1865.
(No objection to his being re-enlisted is known to exist.)*

Said *Private* *Chas. Porter* was born in *Cherokee* Nation
in the State of *East of Mississippi*, is *thirty* years of age,
five feet *ten* inches high, *Indian* complexion, *black* eyes,
black hair, and by occupation, when enrolled, a *farmer*.

Given at Fort Gibson, C. S., this *thirty first* (31st) day of
May 1865.
