Know Ye, That John Flute a Third  
Sergeant of Captain Henry S Andersons  
Company (in Third Regiment of Indian Home Guards  
Volunteers, who was enrolled on the thirty first day of August  
one thousand eight hundred and sixty two to serve three

years or during the war, is hereby Discharged from the service of the United States this thirty first (31) day of May 1865 at Fort Gibson Cherokee Nation by reason of Mustering out - per S.O. No. 110. Hd qrs 8<sup>th</sup> of Arkansas of 1865.

(No objection of his being re-enlisted is known to exist\*)

Said John Flute was born in Cherokee Nation in the State of Georgia is Eighteen years of age five feet eight inches high Dark complexion Black eyes, Black hair, and by occupation when enrolled, a Farmer.  
Given at Fort Gibson C.N. this thirty first (31) day of May 1865.

This sentence will be erased should there be anything in the conduct or physical condition of the soldier rendering him unfit for the Army
