3rd Sergeant of Captain Henry S. Anderson
Company, (M.) Third Regiment of Volunteer U.S.

VOLUNTEERS who was enrolled on the thirty first day of August
one thousand eight hundred and sixty two to serve three years or
during the war, is hereby Discharged from the service of the United States
this thirty first (31) day of May 1865, at Fort Gibson
Cherokee Nation by reason of Muster out of the U.S. Army of 1865
(No objection to his being re-enlisted is known to exist.)

Said John Flute was born in
in the State of Cherokee Nation, is Eighteen years of age,
Five feet Eight inches high, Dark complexion, Black eyes,
Black hair, and by occupation, when enrolled, a Farmer.

Given at Fort Gibson C.N. this Thirty first (31) day of
May 1865.
