TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Knew ye, that John A. Rogers a Corporal of Captain Samuel Bards Company, (I.) 1st Regt of Arkansas Infantry Volunteers, who was enrolled on the 20th day of March 1863, to serve three years or during the war, is hereby discharged from the service of the United States this tenth day of August, 1865, at Fort Smith, Ark under circular 30 war dept A.G.O. series of 1865.

(No objection to his being re-enlisted is known to exist.)

Said John A. Rogers was born in the state of Tennessee, is 20 years of age, five feet six inches high, fair complexion, blue eyes dark hair, and by occupation, when enrolled, a farmer.

Given at Fort Smith Ark, this tenth day of August, 1865.
