TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN.

KNOW YE, That John Spears a private of Captain James H. Bruce Company, (C) 2nd Regt of Indian Infantry Home Guards VOLUNTEERS who was enrolled on the 28th day of August one thousand eight hundred and sixty two to serve three years or during the war, is hereby DISCHARGED from the service of the United States, this thirty first day of May, 1865, at Fort Gibson Cherokee Nation by reason of muster out per S. O. 110 Dept of Arkansas of 1865.

(No objection to his being re-enlisted is known to exist.)

Said John Spears was born in----- in the state of Cherokee Nation is 26 years of age, Five feet six inches high, copper complexion, Black eyes, Black hair, and by occupation when enrolled a farmer.

Given at Fort Gibson C. N. this thirtieth day of May 1865.
