Hulputta Micco, chief of the Seminole Indians, accompanied by Isaac Jones and Parjuck, Harjochee, Seminole leaders, and Mrs. A. B. Davis, interpreter, have left for Mexico to examine the country preliminary to a contemplated migration to that section. A number of the Seminoles feel that the white man is encroaching too closely upon their domain in Indian Territory, and they intend to start a colony in one of the wilder sections of Old Mexico, where they hope the pale face will not come.
