Indian chief. Typescripts of letters (1891-1898); speeches (1884-1898); editorials (1896-1906); and biographical accounts (1903-1908), all relating to Isparhecher while a principal chief of the Creek Nation on subjects such as tribal factionalism, finance, land titles, and related government affairs.

1. *Brother In Red*--August 8, 1891: "Letter of Isparhecher" to Conchinty Micco, Chairman of the National Party re: Isparhecher's nomination as the National Party's candidate for Principal Chief, and the National Party platform.
2. *The Indian Journal*--January 3, 1884: "Message of Spiechee," Principal Chief of the Muskogee Nation.
3. *Indian Journal*--June 12, 1884: "Editorial on Isparhecher" re: his marriage to Alma Harrover.
4. *Wagoner Record*--September 20, 1895: "Election of Isparhecher" as Principal Chief.
5. *Claremore Progress*--September 28, 1895: "Isparhecher," a brief biographical sketch of him given by Captain S. B. Callahan, a close friend of his.
6. *Minco Minstrel*--January 24, 1896: "News Item of Isparhecher" re: his reported death by accidental drowning.
7. *David Progress*--July 23, 1896: "Editorial on Isparhecher" re: his command forbidding non-citizens to make improvements on town lots.
8. *Claremore Progress*--July 25, 1896: "Proclamation of Isparhecher" re: forbidding non-citizens to make improvements on town lots.
9. *Claremore Progress*--August 13, 1896: "Message of Isparhecher" to the National Council re: preparation of correct census rolls by the Dawes Commission.
10. *Purcell Register*--September 24, 1896: "Editorial on Isparhecher" re: the Creek medicine man trying to cure him of the "snake and terrapin" disease.
