

22. Bill No. 14. A memorial requesting continuance of present Choctaw Townsite Commission until its work is completed. Passed Senate October 27, 1904. Passed house and approved October 28, 1904.
23. Bill No. 15. A resolution accepting the report of George W. Scott, National Treasurer. Passed House and Senate October 31, 1904. Approved November 1, 1904.
24. Bill No. 16. A resolution accepting the report of George W. Scott, National Secretary, relative to his contingent fund.
25. A recommendation from Green McCurtain to appoint Calvin Clay as Collector of second district. Confirmed by Senate November 1, 1904.
26. An act to authorize, empower, and direct the Governor of the Chickasaw Nation to appoint and commission two competent and well fitted citizens as commissioners on the part of the Chickasaw Nation to negotiate with the Choctaw People relative to the different reservations of lands specified in existing treaties. Passed House and Senate October 26, 1904.
27. Bill No. 19. An act amending the law relative to County and probate courts and reducing the amount of funds held by County treasurers from \$500.00 to \$50.00. Passed Senate October 31, 1904. Passed House and approved November 1, 1904.
28. Bill No. 20. An act for the relief of Mrs. Annie T. Arnote. Passed and approved November 1, 1904.
29. Bill No. 21. A resolution accepting the report of Peter J. Hudson as National Auditor. Passed Senate, House, and approved November 1, 1904.
30. Bill No. 22. An appeal to T. Roosevelt for the protection of the rights of the Five Civilized Tribes as given them by former treaties. Passed and approved November 1, 1904.
31. Bill No. 23. An act abolishing the office of Board of Health. Passed and approved November 1, 1904.
32. A resolution thanking Honorable Green McCurtain, Principal Chief. Approved November 1, 1904.
33. Bill No. 24. A resolution for the protection of game and fish in Choctaw Nation. Passed and approved November 2, 1904.
34. Bill No. 25. A resolution accepting the report of G.W. Dukes, Green McCurtain and George W. Scott. Passed Senate November 1, 1904. Passed House and approved November 2, 1904.
35. Bill No. 26. A resolution authorizing the auditor to issue warrant for the sum of \$50.00 payable to Silverman and Zimmerman. Passed and approved November 2, 1904.
