Correspondence to Wheeler from John Bruner, Jr. re: appearance in court, June 13, 1882.

Correspondence to Wheeler. re: disputed ownership of cattle, July 13, 1882.

Correspondence from Indian Agent at Quapaw to Wheeler. re: a witness to a murder trial, October 16, 1882.
