Dear Senator:

Congratulations on your election to the U.S. House of Representatives. Our Organization, Start Thinking Of People (S.T.O.P.), has every faith that you will represent us as our 7th District Representative with the same integrity, using your straight forward approach to constituent concerns (alarms) as you have as State Senator.

However, before you leave the position as State Senator, we are requesting you to ask the Michigan Attorney General to investigate the most recent misuse of the justice system by the Calhoun County Courts.

Neither you, as U.S. Representative, the Attorney General nor Gov. Engler should stand for this mockery of a trial to be kept on the Michigan Court Records; while an innocent Michigan Citizen rots in prison for a crime he did not commit.

First, you should know that Gov. Engler was called on 9-29-92 and informed that the <u>Calhoun County Mental Health Dept.</u> was promoting the concept of Non-profit Corporations taking over our Government to all elected and appointed local government officials through the introduction of the Kellogg sponsored Book: ReInventing Government.
