Medical and Other Human Service Needs Assessment for Bay Area Native Americans

The project consists of questionnaire development and analysis with 550 Indian respondents to thirteen page questionnaire.

Klamath Tribes Comprehensive Needs Assessment

Twenty-nine page questionnaire with 1,000 respondents. Funded through grants by Indian Health Service and Bureau of Indian Affairs. Preliminary report published, August 1988. *Analysis and Report* published by Klamath Tribes, January 1989.

Klamath Tribes Management Grant

Comprehensive analysis of health and human service needs of the Klamath Tribe coupled with analysis of services available to the tribe through mainstream programs. Final product to include recommendation of most appropriate health care system for the tribe to develop. 9/1/88-9/1/89 *Hoslentamblek, To Be in Good Health Again* published by Klamath Tribes, 1991.
