Is this not Cherokee Nation jurisdiction area and if so must the Cherokee Nation give a waiver before another tribe can be given Indian land trust status?

Please have someone from your staff contact me concerning this question. Many residents in the proposed area are strongly opposing this type of project.

I do not normally get involved in Native American issues unless asked to do so, however this issue is very important to myself and many residents in my Senate District. I would hope that the Cherokee Nation would not waive jurisdictional boundary for the purpose of another tribe to build a private prison.
