

of Friday, June 26, 1992 and Professor Curcio's letter of Monday, June 29, 1992 are verbatim within the first three paragraphs. Professor Esparza's letter of June 26, 1992, begins by stating, "During the spring semester of 1992, you were counseled on your attendance". He is referring to his File Note of February 3, 1992. Repeating this is harassment. In the next paragraph I am reprimanded for going to the wrong clinical site on the second day of summer school which was also the second day of clinical, June 9, 1992. This resulted in my being late to the O'Donoghue Radiology Department. I had tried to explain to Professor Esparza, I had become conditioned to being assigned one clinical site per rotation schedule and forgot O'Donoghue was in addition to my present OMH assignment. I drove to OMH without thinking. Bobby Vo made the same mistake, but he was not threatened with dismissal, verbally or in written form, nor was he given a "0" grade on his Clinical Rotation Observation Record like I was. Again, I am being treated disparately. In the third paragraph of Professor Esparza's letter to me he cites an infraction of "dress code" for Friday, June 12, 1992. What Professor Esparza is referring to is I did not have on a belt when he saw me at the clinical site on Wednesday, June 10, 1992. (It is not a requirement for the "Wearing Attire for Men" per the Policies and Guidelines for Students in the Department of Radiologic Technology, p12, 1991-93.)
