Former Chief John F. Brown of the Seminole nation and his brother, Jackson Brown, with their families and several Indian girls who are their guests, visited the Indian Territory building at the World's Fair yesterday. The party will remain in St. Louis two weeks to see the exposition.

John F. Brown and Jackson Brown were contributors to the funds which made possible the exhibits of the Indian Territory at the world's fair, and both of them are much interested in the exposition. They are among the wealthiest Indians in the Indian Territory. Jackson Brown is now treasurer for the Seminoles.

The Indians of the Brown party are all highly educated. The young women are pupils and alumnae of Indian schools, and their clothes are as fashionably made as those of St. Louis girls. The party
