ELECTION OF J. F. BROWN

News comes from Wewoka, the Seminole capital, to the effect that at a meeting of the Seminole council recently acting governor of the Seminoles, Jacob Harrison has been impeached and ex-Governor John F. Brown unanimously elected in his place. At a special election Jacob Harrison was selected assistant chief and on the death of Halputta Micco, became acting chief. It is said that the principal charge against Harrison is incompetency. Brown was for many years governor of the Seminoles, has the entire confidence of his people, and was the first Indian in the Territory to effect a treaty between the government and the Indians.
