Governor John Brown of the Seminoles had a long conference with secretary Garfield Sunday relative to the control of the Seminole schools. The department of the interior ordered the schools turned over to the government's school officials here, but Governor Brown and his Indian friends refused to yield control and has successfully defied the school officials. The result of Sunday's conference will be a speedy settlement of the case and the government will take control when the schools are opened. There are large boarding schools run on the contract plan and the contracts in the past have been very profitable.
