legislation authorizing the delivery of the Seminole patents prior to the expiration of the Seminole nation.

Second -- Whether congress has authority to pass legislation modifying the terms of the Seminole agreement of July '98, with reference to the school fund of the nation to assume control of the schools and of school funds.

Third -- As to the constitutionality of the provision declaring full blood Indians cannot alienate their lands for 25 years from the date of approval of the act, unless such restrictions shall prior, to the expiration of said period, be removed by act of congress.

Fourth -- Whether the Seminole trust or invested funds can be distributed in a manner not provided in the agreement of '98 or used for any purpose not mentioned therein.

Fifth -- As to the power of the department to direct that all Seminole warrants issued after January 1, 1907 be approved by the U. S. inspector and paid by the Indian agent instead of being paid by the treasurer of the seminole nation.

Sixth -- Whether patents conveying allotments to Seminole citizens should be delivered before the
