children of the Nation to do right, and to avoid, themselves from drinking, and to try to make an example to their people.

Again First Chief Jno. F. Brown addressed the National Council, making the words that Hulbuttee spoke "tougher." That was the first time he ever spoke strong. And he further said that the day has come when everybody should look out for themselves, telling of the allotment and how bad it would be. And that for this reason everbody, even a Christian, should try to be good, so that Jehovah might not send a curse upon the Nation.

With these addresses he dismissed the National Council the 20th day of this month.
