LOOTED THE GOVERNOR'S STORE

Gov. J. F. Brown and Treasurer Jackson Brown, of the Seminole nation, were held up and robbed at Sasakwa, Seminole nation, on November 10, Sasakwa is 60 miles west of this city, its nearest railroad point, and the news was received by courier Tuesday. The highwaymen secured about \$1,500 in money watches, jewelry and goods. The Brown Bros. have a store at that point and on the evening they, with Hon. G. A. Alexander and two clerks were in the store. Suddenly the inmates heard the command, "hands up." Four masked men entered, ordered the party out of the store, and lining them up, went through their clothes and secured five watches and \$300 in money. Leaving the balance of the party guarded by two of their number the other two robbers took one of the clerks to the store and forced him to open the safe from which \$500 was taken, besides another gold watch and valuable jewelry. The robbers then looted the store.--INDIAN JOURNAL.
