LETTER OF J. F. BROWN

Hon. Henry L. Dawes and Gentlemen of the United States Commission, South McAlester, I. T.

Gentlemen:

We have kept our promise, to earnestly and seriously consider the propositions submitted by you to our body on the 6th ult., embodying substantially the following:

1. The statement, that the United States
Government was dissatisfied with the present state of
affairs as existing in the Indian Territory, and that
the disposition of Congress was to make a change at
no distant day; hence a Commission, known to be friendly
to the Indians, had been selected and appointed to
carry out these wishes by agreement with the Nations of
the Indian Territory, known as the Five Tribes.
