The various townsite delegates from the Territory will remain and work, and when the committee again takes up the bill, the representatives of all interests, will have located the exact features they want modified, and agreed upon just what will be urged in the way of amendment.

If the people of the Indian Territory have any idea that the townsite delegates are not working, and working hard; and that they are not organized and organizing well; and that there is not harmony, and perfect harmony, they are not advised as to what their representatives are and have been doing.
