ELECTION OF J. F. BROWN

On the 3d day of June there will be an election in the Seminole nation for the purpose of electing a principal and a second chief. The voting will take place at Wewoka. Promptly at 10 o'clock on that day the voters will assemble and line up for their choice of candidates to be counted. The present very able and popular governor, J. F. Brown, and Holbutta, are the opposing candidates. Governor Brown has been chief for the last sixteen years, and has, by wise, conservative management, avoided all entanglements and complications both among his own people and with the United States government.

Holbutta is a full-blood and was at one time principal chief of the nation, and has since served several times as second chief, being succeeded by the present second chief, Fus Harjo. Both are popular and strong men. The present chief, during his long term,
