

153. Be it further enacted that the said individual shall be continued in the discharge of said duties until informed by decision(sic) of a Council that his services in that capacity(sic) is no longer needed.

154. Be it further enacted that the said individual shall be required to give bond with good Security & executed in favor of the Creek Nation to the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars before entering upon the duties of his Office for the faithful discharg_ of the same.

155. Be it further enacted that the said individual shall make a report at least once in six months to the proper authorities of this nation the situation and condition of the business to him intrusted.

156. Be it further enacted that the said individual shall receive one half of the profits that may arrise(sic) from the (office) business as remuneration for his services.

By a Council held at North Fork Creek Nation March 25th, 1863, George W. Walker was chosen to sign issue and receive shin plasters in behalf of the Creek Nation as provided by an Act passed on the 24th of March 1863. Before a council held North Fork, Creek Nation March 25th 1863, composed of the proper authorities of the Nation aforesaid(sic) a petition of F. B. Severs for citizenship was duly presented before said Council and was cheerfully received and speedily(sic) granted.
