HOW TO BECOME A SQUAW MAN

The following marriage permit was furnished us by request, and we herewith publish the same so that the reading public may become more acquainted with the requirements demanded of the Indian and exacted of the white man, viz:

MARRIAGE PERMIT

Executive Office, Muscogee Nation.

Okmulgee, February 17, 1882.

To whom These Presents May Come, Greeting:

HEREAS, John Jack has come well recommended by citizens of this Nation, of good standing, as being a person of good moral character, and worthy of having a permit granted.

Therefore I <u>Semuel Checote</u> PRINCIPAL CHIEF OF THE MUSCOGEE NATION, do by power in me vested by law, grant the said <u>John Jack</u> permission to remain in the Muscogee Nation, <u>He having married a citizen thereof</u>, and enjoy all the rights and privileges of a native born citizen, except those rights debarred in law, viz: <u>He</u> shall have no right to participate in the moneys, land interests, or vote in this nation. This permit is subject to the approval of the
