

of our committee by whom was referred that part of
this chiefs message in reference to the carrying of
fire arms at collections of any kind among the
citizens of this Nation. The Committee would most
respectfully report the following bill and urge its
passage.

Sec 1st Be it enacted by the General ^{Conseil} of
the Cherokee Nation assembled, That from
and after the passage of this act, that no
person or persons shall be allowed to carry
Pistols of any character what ever to any
collection or gatherings of the people in this
nation. Provided that this act shall not be
so construed as to interfere with the offices
of this nation.

Sec 2^d Be it further enacted that
any persons or persons who shall be
found violating of this act in any manner
shall be reported by the Sheriff or his
deputies to the County judge of the
County where such offense shall have
been committed, and such offender
shall be fined in any sum of not
less than ten dollars nor more than
twenty five dollars by the court for
every such offense, and such fines
when so collected shall be placed
on the county treasury for county purposes.

Be it further enacted
that this act take effect and be in force
from and after its passage.
