Bill No. 4.

An act entitled an act allowing Stone and Thompson pay for printing the acts and proceedings of the present session of the General Council.

Sec 1.st Be it enacted by the General Council of the Choctaw Nation assembled, That the sum of five dollars per day is hereby allowed Stone and Thompson, for the printing of the acts and proceedings of the ~~General Council~~ ~~present~~ session of the General Council, to be paid out of any money in the hands of the Treasurer, not otherwise appropriated. and the National Auditor is hereby authorized to issue his warrant on the ~~Treasurer~~ ^{and Treasurer} for the same.

Sec 2. - Be it further enacted, That this act take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
