We the joint Committee of both houses on Petitions would beg leave to report that we have rejected the petition of Mrs Elizabeth Moran, who claims Choctaw citizenship, upon the ground of illegal testimony - her brother being one of her witnesses.

and we have also rejected two petitions signed very numerously by our own citizens, asking that Edward Foreman and his wife Jane Foreman and three children Joseph A. Susan F. and Thomas F. Foreman, and C.M. Beck and his wife Martha Beck all of whom are represented as Cherokees; ~~be~~ adopted as Choctaw citizens

Respectfully submitted with the request that we be discharged from further consideration of these cases.
