

An act entitled and act to declare the killing
of dead animals on the range a felony in certain
cases,

Sec 1st Be it enacted by the General Council, of
the Cherokee Nation assembled, That from
and after the passage of this act. It shall
not be lawfull for any person to skin any
animal, ^{the property of another,} found dead on the range without
the written permission of the owner thereof, and
any person so offending, shall be deemed
guilty of a felony and upon conviction, shall
be punished with not more than thirty nine
lashes on the bare back.

Sec 2^d Be it further enacted That any person found
with the hide of any animal in the mark or brand
of another person, without the owner's authority
shall be deemed guilty of petty larceny and
be punished, upon conviction as provided in
Sec 1st of this act, or which hide or hides have the
marks or brands disfigured, and this act be in force
from and after its passage.
