To the General Council

Your Committee on the Principal Chief's message - would ask the passage of the following bill:

An act to incorporate an amendment into the Constitution

Whereas it has been legally and officially announced that the amendment to the Constitution which was properly submitted to a vote of the people at the regular election on the first Wednesday in August 1883 received a majority of all the votes cast, and is in the following language, to-wit:

"The seat of government shall be permanently fixed at or about two and one-half miles east of Old Nanih Waiya" "and shall be called and known as Tushka" "humma, and the first and all future sessions of the General Council shall commence on the first Monday in October" "1884, and each and every year thereafter" "and shall be held at the Tushkahumma" "aforesaid".

Therefore; Be it enacted by the General
Council of the Choctaw Nation assembled that
the amendment aforesaid is hereby in
corporated into the Constitution, to take
the place of the second section to the
amendments to the Constitution adopted
and Approved October 16. 1862. and
the amendment aforesaid shall be
Section 2nd of the Amendments to
the Constitution of the Choctaw
Nation from and after the first
day of January A.D. 1884
