

An act in reference to pay of witnesses.

1      Be it enacted by the General Council of the Choctaw Nation assembled, that in addition to the fees and mileage already allowed witnesses by the law of Oct 26. 1883, to be paid in County scrip, they shall be allowed one dollar per day while attending <sup>Circuit</sup> Court until discharged, in all criminal cases, and in civil cases where the Nation is a party in interest, to be paid out of the National Treasury on the certificates of the Judges of the Courts and attested by the Clerks with the seals of the Courts attached: provided that in no case the costs in a civil suit between individuals are to be paid out of the National Treasury and, provided further; that no officer prisoner or other person whose business takes him or her to Court without a summons or who happens to be present not having been summoned shall not be allowed the above per diem for simply testifying in a case.

2      The act of Nov 10. 1887 is hereby repealed, and this act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
