

An act admitting certain Choctaws from
Mississippi to Citizenship in the Choctaw Nation

Be it enacted by the General Council
of the Choctaw Nation assembled, that
Joe Willis and his children Nancy, Selma
and Frank Willis, and his sister Lincy
Willis; and Billy Willis and his children
Lee and Serena Willis - Thompson Parrell
James Sakti and Thomas Sakti; and
Wallace Sam and his wife Fannie Sam
and their children Milly, Jerry, Luke,
Dilly, Lizzie, Liza and Ess Sam
all having just come from the old Nation
in Mississippi, are hereby admitted to
all of the rights and privileges of citizens-
ship in the Choctaw Nation, and this act
shall take effect and be in force from and
after its passage.
